1. Do I need to pack a lunch each day? / Will lunches be refrigerated? / Can my child microwave their lunch?

Yes, please send your child to camp each day with a lunch and reusable water bottle. Camp may provide options to purchase lunch on special occasions only. Camp does not provide areas to refrigerate or microwave meals. Please consider this when packing your child's lunch.

From "Lunch Tips" on page 15 of the Parent Manual:

Many parents ask us for ideas for ideas on fun nutritious alternatives to sandwiches, hot lunches, and milk for camp lunches. Sometimes these choices are not as enjoyable in the heat of the summer and they are easily spoiled in lunch boxes. New this summer we will offer several ideas in each weeks newsletter and great tips on Facebook for ways to keep kids eating healthy while keeping cool. We highly recommend an insulated soft sided cooler or hard plastic cooler. Paper or plastic bags will not keep food (even food that doesn't spoil easily) cool. Pack lunches the night before and chill all items. Freezer packs help keep all items previously chilled cool. Frozen juice bags pull double duty as freezer packs and cool slushy drinks. Fruit and Veggies provide great nutrition and cool hydrating treats.

2. I don't know what is going on at camp. Where do I get information?

There are several places to get information about camp:

- Weekly Newsletter, emailed on Wednesdays during the camp season
- Parent Board, found near the sign-in/out areas
- Each camp has their own email address and on-site phone to talk with site staff

4. I pay a lot of money each week, where is it going?

Even though the Y of Central Maryland is a non-profit organization, we are not a government-funded organization. The fees charged for camp go directly back into the program and may be used to pay for supplies, staffing costs, rentals, licensing costs, transportation, field trip fees and special guests.
