Dear Friends,

Over the past thirty years, the Y in Central Maryland's Head Start has remained committed to providing a safe place where children can thrive and be assured of equitable access to high-quality education and opportunities. We are proud to be the largest provider of Head Start in Maryland, delivering an exceptional early education to more than 1,800 children and families throughout Baltimore City, Anne Arundel and Baltimore Counties.

With our focus on school readiness, children in Y Head Start are set up for success in school and in life. In fact, the 2018-19 Kindergarten Readiness Assessment reflected that Y Head Start children demonstrated school readiness skills at rate of 6% higher than the Head Start state wide average.

Over the past year, we furthered some of the important work begun in 2017:

- Opened the Y Head Start Center at E. Fayette Street in Baltimore City. In partnership with the Living Classrooms Foundation, the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation and the Office of Head Start, the center was transformed into a state-of-the-art learning center serving 72 children and their families, and is now a flagship early childhood center, exceeding expectations.
- In our second year of implementing the "Perfectly Punctual Campaign," all three Y Head Start regions exceeded 85% attendance for the program year. Perfectly Punctual uses punctuality, positive reinforcement and playfulness to encourage consistent, on-time attendance critical to student success.
- In a continued effort to promote careers in Early Childhood Development and retain Y Head Start Associates, we provided opportunities for Y Associates, Head Start parents and community members to receive the 90-hour Child Care Certification and the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential. In addition to critically needed professional development, this also gives Y Head Start parents in particular, an opportunity to learn more about child development and how it impacts their parent-child relationship.

Recognizing that a child's ability to thrive is dependent on a myriad of interlocking factors, we continue to expand our reach beyond education to provide comprehensive health services supporting dental and physical health, mental health and healthy meals, along with social services, parent engagement, and enrichment opportunities with our network of community partners.

All of this would not be possible without thoughtful collaboration among our parents, community partners, funders, volunteers and talented Y Head Start associates. We are deeply grateful to all for your commitment.

Services and Program Options

It's our vision to ensure that every child develops the skills and abilities necessary to succeed in school and in life. In order to achieve this, we offer a comprehensive range of services and programs specifically tailored to help children perform to the best of their ability and be fully ready for a successful start to school.

Y Early Head Start

Y Early Head Start works with families to help prepare very young children in all developmental areas for the transition to Y Head Start and eventually kindergarten. Y Early Head Start offers two options for families; a home-based program for pregnant mothers and children up to three years old, and a center-based program.


Y Head Start

Y Head Start is for children between three and five years old and is focused on supporting each child's development and school readiness skills. Program components include language and literacy, reading, writing, math, social skills, health and wellness, movement and coordination, art and nutritional awareness. Program options include center-based full-and part-day programming.

In 2017/18:

- We provided Y Head Start to 1,809 children in Anne Arundel and Baltimore Counties and Baltimore City.
- We provided Y Early Head Start services to 169 infants, toddlers and pregnant women in Anne Arundel and Baltimore Counties.

Setting Children and Families Up for Success

Our program focuses on school readiness skills; strengthening a child's ability to enter Kindergarten ready to learn, setting them up for future success in school, and playing a unique role in helping to close the achievement gap.

Y Head Start and Early Head Start follow research-based curriculum that provide teachers with guided lesson plans. This approach supports individualized learning as well as opportunities to foster each child's educational needs.

- Y Head Start uses the innovative Creative Curriculum and Frog Street Curriculum (math and science supplemental curriculum) which involve individualized lesson plans based on classroom ages and student levels.
- The Y Early Head Start home-based program uses the nationally recognized Partners for a Healthy Baby curriculum which helps expectant and parenting families achieve personal goals and build protective factors for the wellbeing of their children.
- Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (SEFEL) is a framework that promotes the social and emotional development and school readiness of young children from birth through age eight. Each Y Head Start region has formed a SEFEL team.


- Through supplemental funding from the Harry & Jeanette
 Weinberg Foundation and PNC Bank, teaching associates
 and mentor coaches receive support services from a SEFEL
 coach. SEFEL coaches provide ongoing coaching to teachers
 and assistant teachers related to SEFEL and pyramid-based
 teaching practices and classroom environments.
- The Y in Central Maryland has enhanced Head Start connections with community partners by redesigning the scope of our Health, Early Childhood and Family Services Advisory Committees. These Advisory Committees are comprised of parents and partners from our three regions resulting in increased awareness and understanding of resources that are available across central Maryland, as well as a focus on shaping policies. Our work will continue over the next five years to intentionally collaborate with these partners as we develop Effort & Effect Plans to meet program and individual child and family goals.

CLASSTM Assessments

To ensure high quality classrooms, we utilize the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASSTM). CLASSTM is an observational instrument developed to measure teacher and child interactions and the emotional and instructional climate of the classroom. We invested in external CLASSTM Observations from, as well as internal CLASSTM Observations from our Early Learning Coaches. The 2017/18 results were used to support professional development plans for teachers, including training opportunities and resources to strengthen teacher and child interactions.



*CLASS™ assessments were conducted quarterly in all Y Head Start classrooms by certified CLASS™ reliable observers affiliated with LiteBrite.

Federal Monitoring Events and Results


Head Start monitoring reviews are performed and utilized by the Office of Head Start (OHS) to gather data and other information to assess grantee program operations and performance. OHS utilizes the information collected during monitoring reviews to understand the grantee's approach to program design, services and continuous program improvement. Due to the cycle of the new Head Start Monitoring Protocol tool, no federal reviews were conducted in 2017–18 program year.



School Readiness Outcomes


Y Head Start utilizes two child assessment tools to track School Readiness Goals. In Baltimore City, a Work Sampling Assessment is used to conduct ongoing child assessments three times during the school year. In Anne Arundel and Baltimore County Early Head Start & Head Start, the Teaching Strategies GOLD® is used to conduct ongoing child assessments three times during the school year.

Parent, Family and Community Engagement

Strong partnerships with parents, families and the community play a key role in a child's school readiness and healthy development. The Y Head Start Parent and Family Engagement goal is families will demonstrate progress towards self-sufficiency, as they access family and community resources are active in their child's education to prepare them for success in life.

Parent & Family Engagement

Y Head Start and Early Head Start encourage the role of parents as their child's first and most important teacher. We understand that children benefit the most when all of the adults who care for them work together toward school readiness skills.

- Through a variety of family engagement opportunities, 345 parents volunteered in Baltimore City, 300 parents volunteered in Baltimore County, and 139 parents volunteered in Anne Arundel County. A total of 178 father/male figures participated in program activities, including father-focused activities.
- Parent Orientation is an annual opportunity for parents and guardians to be guided through a 'Journey to School Readiness'. Multiple opportunities are provided prior to the beginning of the school year to help parents learn about how to prepare their child for school, the benefits of regular school attendance, the importance of health and wellness, and their partnership with Y Head Start. The Orientations were a huge success with over 507 parents attending.
- Parent conferences and home visits provide the opportunity to discuss the child's development and learning progress throughout the school year. During home visits, parents begin to discuss and develop learning goals for their child, as well as, discuss their family goals. Parents participate in 3 parent conferences held quarterly and 2 home visits. 100% of parents participate in parent conferences. 98% of parents participate in home visits.
- Policy Council provides Leadership experiences with the important role to assess ongoing program performance and progress in achieving program and school readiness goals and objectives. Members of these councils also sit on our Y Head Start and Early Head Start Advisory Committees.
- We conduct Family Strength Assessments to help develop a program of useful supports for children and families. Based on the results of the family strengths assessment, 85% of families in Baltimore City, 84% of families in Baltimore County and 88% of families in Anne Arundel County developed family goals. 82% of families in Anne Arundel County, 90% in Baltimore City and 84% in Baltimore County demonstrated progress on family goals. 94% of families were aware of resources in their communities and knew how to access them. 65% of families received support services in the areas of family, health or education. The Net Promoter Score demonstrated that 83% of families believe they are in a better place because of Y Head Start.

Community Engagement

Community partners play a critical role in encouraging children to do their best. Consequently, we work closely with a number of community partners to continuously enhance our program offerings to our Y Head Start families. Y Head Start had 67 volunteers from community agencies and partners. The overall total hours of arent and community volunteers were 20,634 volunteer hours.







Y Head Start / Y Early Head Start Expenditures




